Airport Parkway Pedestrian/Cycling Bridge

Construction of the Airport Parkway Pedestrian/Cycling Bridge is progressing. The contractor is completing the formwork and falsework for the upper portion of the main tower which, when complete, will rise 40 feet above the current height of the tower. Work continues on the ramp joining the existing pathway on the east side of the Airport Parkway to the bridge deck and the contractor is finalizing the installation of the door leading to the South Keys Transit Station.

Heron Road and Riverside Drive – Construction Update

The construction of dedicated transit and cycling lanes along Heron Road at Riverside Drive is complete for the 2012 construction season. During the month of November 2012, staff rehabilitated the pedestrian tunnel running underneath Heron Road and finished the paving of both roadways. The construction site is closed for the winter season, and workers will return in the spring of 2013 to complete reinstatement of the concrete boulevards, finalize the reconnection of the street lighting to its permanent power source and complete landscaping in the area.

On November 30, 2012, the Rink of Dreams officially opened for the 2012-2013 winter season. The 12,500 square foot oval ice surface is a refrigerated outdoor skating facility situated on Marion Dewar Plaza at Ottawa City Hall, 110 Laurier Avenue West. The rink features LED lighting, a heated change hut and picnic tables and benches.

City Celebrates 50 Years of Wastewater Treatment

On November 15, 2012, I was pleased to celebrate the 50th anniversary of the Robert O. Pickard Environmental Centre (ROPEC), which was officially opened on November 15, 1962. ROPEC is Ottawa's first wastewater treatment facility.

Today, as it was 50 years ago, ROPEC is a critical piece of infrastructure for our City. This plant treats all of Ottawa's domestic and commercial wastewater and has allowed the City to become a leader in wastewater treatment. With new technologies, including real time controls, the City can further protect our waterways by managing the volume of sewage and stormwater captured and redirected to ROPEC for treatment. The City also re-uses by-products of the treatment process, including the conversion of digester gases into heat and electricity to run the plant. As part of the celebration, I was honored to open a time capsule, which was buried on the site on November 15, 1962. The time capsule was full of interesting historical items. Another time capsule will be sealed and buried, which will be opened during ROPEC's 100th anniversary in 2062.

Winter Overnight Parking Regulations

The City of Ottawa's winter overnight parking regulations are now in effect and will last until **April 1, 2013**. When a snowfall of 7 cm or more is forecast by Environment Canada, parking is prohibited on all Ottawa streets between 1:00 and 7:00 a.m. This includes any forecast for a range of snow that includes 7 cm, such as a snowfall forecast of 5 to 10 cm. Vehicles parked on the street when a restriction is in effect will be ticketed, even if it does not snow. Also keep an eye out for temporary "no parking, snow removal" signs on city streets, even when no snow is forecast.

You can sign up to receive e-mail or Twitter notifications of overnight parking restrictions at <u>ottawa.ca</u>. After signing up, you will receive an e-mail or Twitter alert via @ottawacity every time a winter overnight parking restriction goes into effect or is lifted. You can also find out if an overnight parking restriction is in effect by calling 3-1-1 or by tuning in to local media.

Congratulations to Order of Ottawa Recipients

On November 22, 2012, fifteen of Ottawa's most outstanding residents were inducted into the Order of Ottawa. New Street Food Vendors

The City of Ottawa will grant up to 20 new street food vending licences in 2013 as part of a new initiative approved by City Council in October 2012. This initiative aims to increase the diversity of food offered on City streets, meaning that more vendors will offer a wider variety of food in more communities.

If you are interested in being a vendor, applications are now available online at <u>ottawa.ca</u>. Proposals will be reviewed by a volunteer selection panel of Ottawa chefs and food experts. Applications are due by **January 4, 2013**.

Ottawa Light Rail Transit – Update and Design Showcases

In September 2012, the City received submissions from three world-class consortia for the construction and maintenance of Ottawa's Light Rail Transit (OLRT) project. These submissions have been assessed following the Infrastructure Ontario evaluation process. A recommendation will be made in December to be considered by the Committee of the Whole and City Council.

This recommendation will include the details of the recommended proponent's design, construction schedule and cost of the OLRT project for Council's review and approval. The report will seek authority for staff to finalize negotiations with the recommended proponent and execute the contract to begin construction in early 2013.

The report will first be considered by Committee of the Whole on December 12, 2012, then rise to Council on December 19, 2012. Design showcases will be held across the City to provide you with the opportunity to view the project designs.

December Initiatives

The City of Ottawa's Selective Traffic Enforcement Program (STEP) will focus on **speeding** and **impaired driving** during the month of December 2012.

Speeding or not slowing down for road and weather conditions was attributed to 16,231 reportable collisions with 70 fatalities and 4,709 injuries between 2007 and 2011. In the same time period, there were 1,818 collisions related to impaired driving, with 34 fatalities and 764 injuries. Eighty percent of the impaired drivers were male and 30 percent were between the ages of 16 and 24.

October Results

During the month of October 2012, the STEP program laid a total of 74 charges. 43 motorists were charged for speeding in construction zones. Under the pedestrian safety initiative, 7 pedestrians were charged for disobeying a "don't walk" signal, 6 motorists were fined for failure to yield to a pedestrian and 5 tickets were issued to pedestrians for failure to use a crosswalk. 13 additional unclassified charges were also laid for pedestrian safety.
